

Call for Applications Incubator Grant: Strand B: International & Innovative Joint Educational Initiatives

Introduction

The European University Alliance ENLIGHT announces the **3rd and final** round of the Incubator Grant call. Aligning with ENLIGHT's main objective of widening bottom-up engagement in our university communities, Incubator Grants support the development and upscaling of **international and innovative joint educational initiatives that are ECTS-credit bearing**, connected to ENLIGHT's [Focus Areas](#) - Health and Well-being, Digital revolution and Impact of Digitization, Climate Change, Energy and circular economy, Culture and Creativity, Equity. Eligible activities are educational initiatives in various formats that can be sustainably integrated into (a) study programme(s). Funding for the selected projects through Incubator Grants is available from 1st September 2026 to 31st October 2027, which is also the recommended period for project implementation .

The call consists of **two strands**:

Strand A: Joint study programmes. This strand supports the development of joint study programmes at bachelor's or master's level among partner universities. A joint study programme is defined as an integrated curriculum coordinated and offered jointly by different higher education institutions¹. The aim is to award joint degrees², but proposals with double/multiple degree awarding are also eligible. The joint study programme does not have to be ready to run by the end of the Incubator Grant project period, but a minimum set of deliverables is expected.

Strand B: International and innovative joint educational initiatives. This strand is meant to develop educational initiatives that bring innovation and internationalization to teaching. This can comprise seasonal schools, lifelong learning activities, micro-credentials, double degree schemes³, and any joint courses in physical, virtual or blended format (see also the [ENLIGHT Toolkit for virtual and blended learning formats](#) and a

³ A double degree scheme is an arrangement between two educational institutions where each offers its own separate study programme, rather than a joint study programme. Students can choose to complete part of their studies at a partner institution, allowing them to earn two separate diplomas—one from each institution. The specific terms and structure of the double degree scheme are formalized in an agreement between the partner institutions. This arrangement can apply to both bachelor's and master's programmes.

[Creating ENLIGHT Lifelong Learning Micro-Credentials](#)). The only exception is that this grant cannot be used to develop Erasmus+ Blended Intensive Programmes (BIP's).

Eligibility criteria - Strand B

1. At least 3 participating ENLIGHT institutions are involved, with the following exceptions: for double degree schemes, virtual exchanges and micro-credentials at least 2 participating ENLIGHT institutions are involved.
2. All project partners applying for funding are affiliated with one of the ENLIGHT universities.
3. All activities requiring funding from Incubator Grant must be completed by October 31, 2027.
4. Outputs should be open to appropriate staff and/or students of the involved ENLIGHT universities.
5. The funding guidelines differentiate between the role of coordination and that of partners. Academics with teaching obligations can submit a project as coordinator. Coordinators as well as partners must be entitled to manage a budget at his/her university and remain in position for the duration of the proposed project. Please note that regulations differ between the ENLIGHT universities. Please contact your ENLIGHT coordinator in case of doubt.
6. The scope of the initiative should refer to the identified [Focus Areas](#). These focus areas should not be seen as disciplinary categories.
7. The initiative awards ECTS credits (or a Transcript of Records, which can be recognized by ECTS credits).
8. The application form must be correctly completed, including a breakdown of the budget. If several items of significant importance for the evaluation of the project remain unfilled in the application, the call coordinators reserve the right to exclude it.

(The criteria are formulated in line with the [ENLIGHT Competence Framework](#).)

Funding

Applications under the Strand (A) Joint study programmes can apply for a maximum of €30.000 EUR. Applications under the Strand (B) International and innovative joint education initiatives can apply for a maximum of **€20.000 EUR**. **The total maximum amount allocated for the implementation of the third round of the Incubator Call is €226.000.**

ENLIGHT Incubator Grant funding originates from Erasmus+ funding, except for the University of Bern. In the case of parallel applications to other EU funds for the same purpose, the same costs may under no circumstances be financed twice. Due to the non-association of Swiss universities in Erasmus+, members of the University of Bern receive funding from

Movetia. All mobilities to Bern must be included in the University of Bern's share of the project budget, rather than in that of the sending university.

If the project includes physical student mobility, applicants should consult the available funding options at their home university or institutional ENLIGHT office prior to submitting their application as certain restrictions may apply to them.

Each partner university in the project receives its share of the requested budget. Funding **cannot be transferred** between universities. This means that if a team member leaves, even to a partner university, the budget share remains at the original university/faculty, and the university/faculty must nominate a replacement for the departed member so that the project can continue.

Selection criteria

Applications are evaluated in four categories, with a total of 100 points available:

- Quality (max 30 points)
- Feasibility (max 30 points)
- Proposed output (max 30 points)
- Added value (max 10 points)

Each criterion in a category can be awarded 10 points.

1. Quality (30%)

1.a The proposal has clearly defined objectives in terms of the planned educational initiatives and defines its overall learning outcomes.

1.b The target group is clearly described. The proposal demonstrates the benefits of internationalization for the intended target group.

1.c The proposal demonstrates innovativeness in educational methods.

2. Feasibility (30%)

2.a The initiative is embedded in regular institutional processes. The proposal demonstrates that the participating faculty and/or the study program support the initiative.

2.b The proposal describes how the initiative can be continued after the end of funding and outlines a possible plan to ensure the sustainability of the initiative.

2.c The proposal demonstrates the project's feasibility. It includes a detailed and realistic budget that illustrates how resources (financial, human, and material) will be allocated effectively to achieve the project's objectives. It clearly describes the roles and competencies of each project partner.

3. Proposed output (30%)

3.a The proposal clearly describes the expected outputs and how they align with the overarching learning outcomes.

3.b The proposal reflects how outputs will be measured, reported, and communicated.

3.c The proposal describes the project timeline.

4. Added value (10%)

4.a The initiative shows added value for the intended target group and the universities involved.

Steps for selection

STEP 1: Applications are evaluated on eligibility criteria by the ENLIGHT project staff.

STEP 2: Independent reviewers from ENLIGHT universities rank applications using the selection criteria.

STEP 3: The final selection of Incubator Grant recipients is made by the WP2 Executive Group, which consists of vice-rectors, vice-presidents, directors or equivalents responsible for education at all ENLIGHT universities. Quality is taken into account, with a threshold of 70% being used, as well as balanced participation among ENLIGHT universities.

Collaboration with universities underrepresented in previous ENLIGHT calls is strongly encouraged (University of the Basque Country, University of Bordeaux, Comenius University, University of Goettingen, University of Tartu).

Application procedure and timeline

Applications should be submitted by the coordinator of the educational proposal through the online [application form](#) at the ENLIGHT central online submission point. Please convert your proposal form(s) into one .pdf file labeled as "ACRONYM-INCUBATOR-B-2026.pdf".

Reporting

The coordinating institution is requested to submit a final report (Annex 3) by **10th November 2027 the latest**. Projects that end their activities earlier shall submit their final report within one month of the end of activities, but no later than November 10, 2027.
